Way to go everyone!



Advent is the first season on the Christian calendar. It is a time of preparation. This is true both of the secular world and the Christian world. Yes, there's all the shopping and pictures with Santa, but the real meaning has nothing to do with either.

There are several tools you can use to show what Advent means and to prepare your child for the religious part of Christmas. One of them is an Advent wreath. Every Sunday, we light the appropriate candles and read the sections of the story relevant to that Sunday.

At the onset of Advent, evergreen boughs, wreaths and trees are displayed in churches. This green is to symbolize the promise of life brought on by the birth of Jesus Christ.

Traditionally, holly was also displayed with the evergreen decorations, which is why the colors red and green are associated with Christmas.

Purple has traditionally been the primary color of <u>Advent</u>, symbolizing <u>repentance</u> and <u>fasting</u>. Purple is also the color of royalty, demonstrating the anticipation and reception of the coming King. Today, however, many churches have begun to use **blue** instead of purple, as a means of distinguishing Advent from <u>Lent</u>.

Pink (or **rose**) is also one of the colors of Advent used during the third Sunday. It represents joy or rejoicing and reveals a shift in the season away from repentance and toward celebration.

White is the color of the center Advent candle, representing purity. Christ is the sinless, spotless, pure Savior. Also, those who receive Christ as Savior are washed of their sins and made whiter than snow.

Important Items: These are some of St. Anthony School's expectations to help keep our school running more smoothly:

- Office hours are 8:00-4:00. Parents please insure you call the office 780-542-4396 or email kerrie.lemermeyer@starcatholic.ab.ca if your child will be late or absent. If you have reached the answering machine please leave a message as staff are unavailable to answer the phone.
- For the safety of your child(ren) please do not drop him/her off before 8:20 am as there is no supervision and the doors do not open until 8:20 am.
- All students arriving after the morning bell (8:35am) or leaving school property before the dismissal bell (3:09pm), must sign in/out at the office.
- ♦ For the safety of students & staff, ALL Volunteers & Visitors MUST sign in at the office.
- Please make sure that your children are dressed according to the weather. Students are expected to play outside during our recesses. The Division's weather policy is to have students stay indoors only if the weather is minus 25 below (Celsius) including wind chill. Proper winter attire includes mittens, hat, warm coat, ski pants, and winter boots. It's also a really good idea, to pack extra clothing (such as pants, underwear, t-shirt and socks) in your child(ren)'s backpack in case they get all wet.
- ♦ Microwaves are available for those students in grades seven & eight only. We would like to take this time to remind parents/ guardians that there will be NO microwaves in the classrooms or microwave access for students in grades Kindergarten − 6.
- ♦ If you are interested in volunteering please call Michelle @ 780-621-7721. Parents/Guardians; to ensure your child/children receive their lunch order, ALL orders MUST be pre-ordered & pre-paid. Any "last minute" orders are subject to availability. Our Hot Lunch program is run on a volunteer basis.
- ♦ Taking holidays during the school year may result in students missing valuable learning which may result in students missing valuable learning which may have a negative effect on their academic progress. However, we do understand that because of differing circumstances this may occur in various families. Although our teachers are committed to helping your child progress, please understand that it is not reasonable to request that the teacher prepare detailed lessons or homework missed during your child's absence. Students are responsible for catching up on all missed assignments within a reasonable time frame determined by the teacher through consultation with the student and family.
